# PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE - 2020 - 2021 BOARD OF DIRECTORS



As we celebrate 20 years, I am excited to announce that we have grown our endowment fund to over 3.5 million dollars! Our grants have grown from \$1,650 in 2002 to \$89,570 in 2021 and we have given out over \$723,070 over the past 20 years. Our first scholarship was given out in 2006 and this has grown to 13 scholarships in 2021 with a current annual total value of \$14,800.

A big thank you to the generous individuals, families, sponsors, City of Quesnel, Cariboo Regional District (Northern Directors), Northern Development Trust, Vancouver Foundation, and our annual anonymous donor which has allowed us to succeed as a Foundation.

As the Quesnel Community Foundation (QCF) is celebrating the 20th Anniversary this year, I am very proud to serve as the current President of this great organization, working with the Board of Directors who give so much of their time and talent to make our Foundation such a success. This board has stepped up during the challenges of COVID-19 and administered 3 additional grants totaling \$100,000 during this time to assist many non-profits in our community. This was made possible thanks to the Community Foundation of Canada, Government of Canada, and the Vancouver Foundation.

Once again, our annual Community Fall Challenge Campaign will begin on October 15th, 2021; thanks to our extremely

generous anonymous donor matching up to \$50,000 to our endowment fund.

Our community and Foundation like so many others, have faced challenges due to COVID-19 limiting fund-raising events like our Annual Gala. We look forward to seeing you at our next Gala which will celebrate our 20 years of giving, when restrictions allow.

As I look to the future of QCF, I see so much potential for growth as we implement our new Business Plan which will guide the Board through the next 10 years.

The Foundation said goodbye to Director's Brenda Gardiner and Bruce Broughton this year. Bruce served on the Foundation for the past six years as Vice President, Grants Chair, and on the Investment Committee while Brenda served on the Grant Committee. We thank them for their dedication and support to the Foundation. We are pleased to welcome Kathy Somerville and Sandra Lewis to our board, we know they will be a valuable asset to our organization.

In closing, I want to recognize and thank the 5 president's and 38 directors who have come before us on this incredible journey and once again, thank you to our entire community and volunteers for their tireless support.

It all began with a successful 2000 British Columbia Winter Games hosted by the City of Quesnel. The Games Legacy funds of \$50,000 was matched by The City of Quesnel and the Vancouver Foundation. The Endowment Fund has now reached 3.5 million dollars today.

- 2001 Brian Rankin was the First President. Our Logo was developed through a local competition with CSS student Jason PettyJohn designing our logo we still used today.
  - 2002 Our First Gala Awards Night Fundraiser (Emerald Ball) was very well attended.
  - 2003 The first family funds were Glen & Loretta Barr and Harry and Mildred Keen.
  - 2005 QCF first Scholarship/Bursary was established in memory of Marilyn Heywood. West Fraser Mills donates \$100,000 to the QCF.
  - 2006 First Scholarship winner for was Kayla McColl for \$150.
  - 2007 Island Mountain Arts Fund establishes an Agency Endowment Fund of \$10,000.
  - 2008 Holger Bauer Forestry Safety Endowment Fund was founded.
  - 2010 The Quesnel Woodlot association Ted Kennedy Bursary was established. The fall fund raising campaign with support of a match of \$10,000 began.
  - 2011 The Quesnel Foundation celebrated 10 years and reached \$1 million dollars.
  - 2013 The Foundation distributed \$50,000 in Grants, Scholarships and Bursaries.
  - 2015 The Endowment Fund reached \$2,000,000. Our Anonymous Donor Campaign matches up to \$50,000.
  - 2018 QCF has awarded over half a million dollars to our community for a grand total of \$556,267.
  - 2019 The Foundation administered the RBC Future Launch Challenge supported by the Community Foundations of Canada to the Quesnel Pride Society.
  - 2020 We partner with Community Foundations of Canada, Government of Canada, and Vancouver Foundation to award \$100,000 in grants for COVID-19 Relief in the community.
  - 2021 Quesnel Community Foundation Endowment Fund reaches \$3,500,000.
